SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT PLANNING

The school has a three-year SDP which focuses on raising standards across all areas of school ranging from pastoral care, and areas of the curriculum to site maintenance & development. Specific focus will be on problem solving and strategy usage to break down investigations in Numeracy and in comprehension skills within Literacy.

The Revised Curriculum builds on the good classroom practice which teachers already have and in-service training continues to develop these areas. A significant amount of work is currently being undertaken in terms of classroom practice, learner performance and data analysis in Literacy and Numeracy within self evaluation. We are implementing Assessment for Learning in terms of formative feedback and developing pupil and peer evaluation of their own work. Thinking skills and Personal Capabilities are being visibly promoted and the development of strategies that can be used to attack problems is being promoted actively. Teachers are using the classroom technology to enhance the nature of daily interaction and we are embracing the active teaching methods promoted within the Revised Curriculum.

SPECIAL NEEDS PROVISION

St Anne's Primary School continues to implement the Code of Practice for the identification and assessment of children with special educational needs. Provision for children with special educational needs is outlined as follows:

- Education Plans drawn up, implemented and reviewed by Special Needs Coordinator, class teacher and support teacher.
- Provision of Classroom Assistant support where possible
- Liaison with Special Needs Department, Education Authority.
- Liaison with various agencies: Literacy Support, ASD, EWO, Education Psychology,
 Scrabo Childrens' Centre, Hearing Support.
- Reading Partnership
- R.I.S.E.(NI) team working with teachers and children from Years 1 to 3 to meet needs in terms of speech & language/behaviour/motor skills/ thinking skills.
